Question One:

Decide whether the following statements are True or False:

1. All Courts of UK are administered by Her Majesty's Courts and Tribunals Service.
2. The Judicial Committee of the Privy Council is the court of final appeal for the High Court of Justiciary in Scotland for issues related to devolution.
3. The UK Court of Appeal consists of three divisions: civil, criminal and Chancery.
4. The interrogatory of the accused by the presiding judges is one of the features which distinguished the French criminal procedure from the Anglo-American system.
5. The UK magistrate court has a jury to decides if the accused is guilty or not, but the judge decides what sentence he should get.
6. Appeals to the UK Supreme Court are unusual in that a certification must made that there is a point of law of general public importance.
7. The UK attorney general is the most senior public prosecutor who is accountable to Parliament for the work of the CPS.
8. Bothe French and Anglo-American legal systems treat pretrial detention as the exception rather than rule.
9. The CPS does not always oppose the appeal against conviction or sentence which is lodged by a defendant.
