- () **1- Health** is defined as a state of physical, mental and social well being not merely the absence of disease or infirmity.
- () **2- Social health** refers to the ability to Make and maintain relationship with others.
- () **3- Wellness** behaviors are those that promote healthy functioning and help prevent illness.
- () **4- In Host –Agent – Environment Model**, health is interpreted as the absence of signs and symptoms of disease or injury; thus, the opposite of health is disease.

- () **10- Primary care level:** It is a level of care that is specialized and highly technical in diagnosing and treating complicated or unusually health problems.
- () **11- Screening** is an example of primary prevention.
- () **12- Rehabilitation** after stroke is an example of secondary prevention.
- () **13- Health care as a right** means that equal access to health care is viewed as every one's fundamental human right, rich or poor and it is run as a national health service (NHS).
- () **14- Consumerism** is the public expectation that it will have a voice in determining the type, quality and cost of health care.
- () **15- Inter-sectoral approach-** means that equitable distribution of services, resources and facilities for the entire population.
- () **16- Health prevention:** is aimed at stopping the disease process before it starts or preventing further deterioration of a condition that already exist.

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- () 17- **The community as a client** refers to the broader concept of wide community as people for the nursing services in focus.
- () 18- **The community** directly influences the health of the individuals; families, groups, and populations who may be a part of it.
